My Donors Choose project got funded! "A Start to a Hands-On Classroom" was written to request resources to help my classroom become more hands on. Recently the state of Tennessee adopted the Next Generation Science standards which require teachers and students to approach science from a different perspective. An example of the materials requested include several molecular model sets where students are able to build different molecules covered in class in macromolecules, photosynthesis, and cellular respiration. Hopefully, the hands-on opportunities these kits provide will help students make abstract concepts more concrete. The projected cost totaled \$953.60 worth of resources. #### LEGISLATIVE UPDATE SOCIAL SECURITY LEGISLATION

The Social Security And Medicare Lock-Box Act (H.R.1218) would prohibit Congress from utilizing money in the Social Security and Medicare Trust Fund for anything other than Social Security and Medicare. It should be noted that in the past Congress has used some of the money in the Social Security and Medicare Trust Fund for other purposes.

The Social Security Guarantee Act (H.R.991) would guarantee that Social Security would continue to be paid and that it would include <u>reasonable</u> Cost Of Living Adjustments (COLA).
