

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

Violence Against Women Act

The Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) has expired. Specific bills to reauthorize VAWA were offered and referred to committee. None of these bills were acted on in any committee to which they were referred. It was attached to a bill to fund the govt. The

bill was passed by both houses, but it was not signed into law, allowing the bill to expire. Several members of Congress have vowed to introduce new legislation to put VAWA into effect early in the next session of Congress.
