LEGISLATIVE UPDATE THE DOCTOR IS IN THE HOUSE

Representative Dr. Kim Schrier, a newly elected representative from Washington, is a pediatrician. She introduced <u>H.J.Res.38</u> entitled "Removing the deadline for the ratification of the Equal Rights Amendment" which currently has 213 cosponsors. Dr. Schier also introduced the Vaccines Act of 2019 (**H.R.2862**). This act would "provide for a national system for surveillance of vaccine rates, to authorize research on vaccine hesitancy, and increase public understanding of the benefits of immunizations." This bill currently has 23 cosponsors.
